


Talking about Race in Church

In April, we embarked on a five week study of Debby Irving's book, *Waking Up White: Finding Myself in the Story of Race*. In part, this is in response to an invitation from the Co-Moderators of the 222nd General Assembly of the PC(USA), to discuss some of the themes raised in the book. So far, we have covered our racial identity, the concept of race as a whole, and the systematic racism that is pervasive in our country. Since beginning the study, I have received some questions about what we are discussing in the class. I thought I would use some space in the newsletter this week to explain a few topics we are discussing.

Helpful definitions when talking about race (adapted from "*Facing Racism: A Vision of the Intercultural Community-Churchwide Antiracism Policy*"):

White Privilege: John Calvin, understood sin as a corporate state of all of humanity rather than an individual belief, action, or moral failing. As such, we must have humility about our own righteousness and must adhere to the grace of God in Jesus. Schleiermacher expanded on this a little with his use of "original sin" and "actual sin." Actual sin would be the sinful actions and beliefs of each person. Original sin would be the communal ways of being that are in opposition to God. This brings us to white privilege. The actual sins of bigoted beliefs, hate crimes, prejudice, and intentional discrimination stem from, and contribute to, the original sin of systematic racism that permeates our culture and society. No one today needs to commit an actual sin for such inequality to continue. White people in the USA continue to reap the benefits of being white, even when, individually, they believe in the equality of all people. This is what is known as white privilege. Just as people of color did not choose to be oppressed, white people (most of them, anyway) did not actively choose to have privilege.

Prejudice: Prejudice is understood to be judgments made in the absence of due examination and consideration of facts; and these judgments are held even when contradicted by facts. They are often driven primarily by emotional responses such as fear. When prejudice is based on racial consideration it is racial prejudice. However, racial prejudice alone is not racism.

Racism: When racial prejudice is combined with power it becomes racism. Racism is a consequence of learned values and behaviors. Racism is nurtured and sustained by systematic power. Using these three definitions, we are discussing our own perceptions when it comes to race, our racial and cultural heritage, and exploring some of the ways in which we are privileged.

Why talk about race in church? Shouldn't we stay out of all that political stuff?

The Bible insistently reveals that God loves diversity and justice. Racism is the opposite of what God intends for humanity. It is the rejection of the other, and that is entirely contrary to the Word of God incarnate in Jesus Christ. The church today exists in the world as it is: a world fraught with systematic racism, injustice, and intolerance. We have made great strides in the past, but our work is not done. God's vision for humanity, a vision of justice and diversity, remains unrealized. We are not fulfilling God's call if we simply exist in the comfort of our safety bubbles. This is why we need dialogue surrounding race. This is why we need safe space to engage in such conversation.

You too can join in on the conversation! On May 20th, KGPC will host "Racial Taboo," a video documentary surrounding conceptualizations of privilege. We have also created a Facebook Group for discussion and sharing of resources that you can join! You can access the group through our KGPC Facebook page. 




Summer Ladies' Bible Study: June 13th—August 1st

Confirmation 2018

Confirmation will occur biannually for grades seven and eight. The first year of this model (2018) included seven 7th – 9th graders. Ally Restrepo, Kyle Restrepo, Charleigh Beekler, Ainsley Hetherington, Sean McNulty, Maddie Camlet, and Bryn Jones completed Confirmation this year. Components of the program included, weekly 1.5 hour meetings following the traditional church service, bi-weekly meetings with mentors, completing *Journey Through The Bible* workbook, writing a statement of faith, participation in a retreat, individual meetings with the teachers, field trips, and service projects.

Youth in the program completed two mission projects: serving dinner at JCOC and serving dinner to our winter shelter guests. They went on two field trips in our time together as a group. One trip was to visit Temple Emanuel Synagogue at the oceanfront and one was right across the street at St. Nicholas Catholic Church. They also completed a Bible workbook called *Journey Through the Bible* that works through the entirety of the Bible.

Throughout the process, youth were able to think about their faith more in depth. We spent time talking through major theological concepts, how faith relates to everyday life, and oriented the group with Presbyterian and church beliefs. We are immensely proud of the work that each of the Confirmation students has put into this process. Their hard work has shown that they are devoted, faithful, and have grown in their relationships with God and with each other.

Most white people don't bring it up with a black person because they fear the potential shame of having their prejudice revealed. Many black folks don't want to bring up the subject because they don't trust white folks to be honest about their beliefs or that this time will be any different than the past. As a result we don't know each other.

In fact, a recent Reuters Poll on race indicated that 40% of white Americans do not have a friend (often not even an acquaintance) of a different color. Racial Taboo events are working to change that in an innovative way using film, and it's working.


Circles will meet on May 8, 2018


